

Treasurer of the Board

The job of the treasurer is more oversight than hands-on. The treasurer no longer keeps the financial records for the organization, but rather oversees the financial records of the organization, and ensures that the board regularly receives good reports of the financial condition of the organization.

The treasurer also:

- chairs the Finance Committee.
- serves on the Executive Committee.
- interprets monthly financial reports to the full board.
- examines monthly financial reports to interpret trends and projections, and to inquire regarding operating policies, plans and decisions.
- in cooperation with the executive, provides the board with insight and knowledge of financial plans, controls and results.
- in cooperation with the executive, assists the board to understand the annual budget before approval by the board.
- arranges for an annual internal audit of the organization's financial operations and records.

All officer positions require a commitment of extra time and responsibility. Board members who cannot make this extra commitment should not seek or accept this office.
